

Full Time Physiotherapy Position

The successful candidate will be joining the Physiotherapy Department of the Fowler Kennedy Sport Medicine Clinic (fowlerkennedy.com/services/physiotherapy/). Renumeration will be commensurate with the applicant's qualifications and experience. The anticipated start time as negotiated in 2024.

Preference will be given to candidates who:

1) Have completed a Masters or advanced practice degree or equivalent

2) Have advanced level clinical practice expertise in sport and exercise medicine

3) Have excellent organizational, interpersonal skills and excel working in a team environment

4) Registered in good standing with, or is eligible for registration with, the College of Physiotherapists of Ontario

5) Have experience or interest in sport medicine event coverage, working with varsity, competitive and community athletes

6) Responsibilities may include providing care in various clinic environments including any or all of the Fowler Kennedy Sport Medicine Clinics, Varsity Clinics, sport coverage, teaching/mentoring and other duties as required.

The successful candidate will demonstrate a capacity to practice and learn in a clinical practice model of interprofessional sport and exercise medicine care delivery.

- Cover letter that outlines their interest and qualifications for the role
- Curriculum Vitae
- Brief statement of teaching experience, sport coverage, any research accomplishments, and career plans

The Fowler Kennedy Sport Medicine Clinic is recognized locally and internationally as a leader in sport and exercise medicine, with long-standing and internationally renowned fellowship programs in orthopedic surgery, primary care and physiotherapy. Founded in 1974 by the late Dr. Jack Kennedy and Dr. Peter Fowler, the Clinic was initially established to provide care for varsity athletes at Western University. Today the Clinic is a large sport medicine centre offering a multi-disciplinary approach to prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of sport injuries for active individuals from recreational to elite athletes. The Clinic is a dynamic center for patient care, research, and education through collaborative partnerships with leaders in healthcare, academia, and the private sector. Mentorship opportunities exist with several therapists credentialed as FCAMPT, Sport Diploma, Advanced Health Care Practice and Pelvic Health.
